Volunteering at the Booktique

Yesterday one of our volunteers checked her work area go from the fitness tracker at the end of her shift. "Three miles already! And most of it here in the store!" It got me thinking about how healthy it available nook and cranis to volunteer here. While the **Booktique** Workout doesn't compare to pulling ivy at Tryon Creek Park (we have several volunteers who also do that each week), it is definitely a workout.
