

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - February, 2015

During January The Friends of Lake Oswego Public Library gave out 300 copies of *All The Light We Cannot See*, the 2015 LO Reads book choice, to current members of The Friends and 480 books to library cardholders. This represents the start of the 9th Annual LO Reads event which this year has approximately 30 events planned for February.

For each of the 9 years of LO Reads The Friends have purchased the books and with the exception of the first year, we have paid the expenses to have the authors come speak. From the beginning the program has been a success and has grown to involve many in our community. This year's book, All The Light We Cannot See, is #1 on several of the national booklists so we are pleased to have the author, Anthony Doerr, coming to Lake Oswego.

This program as well as many of the other wonderful programs that the LO Library puts on during the year are made possible by financial support from the Friends of Lake Oswego Public Library. Profits from our used bookstore, The Booktique, are the major source of our support but member dues and gifts also help.

FYI -- a few years ago our membership totaled 170+ and I mentioned that my goal was to reach 500 members in the next few years. As of January, 2015 our membership count is 542!!! How about 700 members by 2016?

Thank you to all of you for joining The Friends and helping us support our Library and its programs. Tell your friends about us and encourage them to join so we can continue to keep our library Oregon's #1 library.

MESSAGE FROM OUR MANAGER

Old books, new treasures - Manager's Notes

I grew up two blocks from a wonderful dark-brown shingled gambrel-roofed Carnegie Library. It was one of the first places I was allowed to walk on my own, and every week my older brother and I would carry our armloads of library books back and exchange them for new armloads. As I got a little older and had homework assignments, my friends and I would meet at the library after school to work together in the reference room, dragging multiple volumes of the World Book Encyclopedia to a huge oak table. We would spread them out and follow every "see" and "see also" reference until the reference librarian came by to remind us to put all those volumes away, in order please, before we went home.



Each spring the Friends of the Library held a book sale in the basement of that great old library. My brother and I would take our little red wagon and bring home boxes full of books. If we rationed them we would still have some left to read when school let out for summer vacation and we could spend all day reading. To quote Reading Rainbow, a TV show that didn't arrive until decades later (Wikipedia says 1983), "I can go anywhere, take a look, it's in a book." We could go anywhere and be anything in our books.

Every day at the Booktique is a little like that annual sale at my old hometown library. At the Booktique a person can fill a little red wagon with treasures for less than the cost of a movie with popcorn. As an adult it's a little harder to carve out a whole day for reading, but you don't have to wait for a once-a-year sale for inspiration. Five days a week every week we offer you a wonderful opportunity to find other worlds and other lives in a book. You too can go anywhere or be anything, in a book. See you at the Booktique!

The Friends Create a Permanent Endowment

We are pleased to announce that we have partnered with the Oregon Community Foundation (OCF) and created The Friends of the Lake Oswego Public Library Fund. With the OCF's stewardship and long term investment program, our endowment fund will be maintained in perpetuity to provide a stable stream of income that will support our Library.

With this partnership, we are able to offer our donors the opportunity to make a permanent gift to ensure future funding for our Library work. Through the OCF, the Friends are able to accept gifts such as securities, personal property, and real property upon approval of OCF's gift acceptance committee. We are also able to offer our donors the option of making a planned gift, often called a deferred gift, which will ultimately benefit our endowment fund. The OCF staff will work with us and our donors to create bequests, charitable remainder trusts (CRT) and gift annuities.

The OCF is a statewide nonprofit organization that administers permanent charitable funds established through gifts from individuals, families, businesses and other organizations. The OCF currently administers over 1800 permanent funds with assets over \$1.6 billion.
