

V'Anne was invited by Jack Radow (a founder of the BOOKtique) to come to the bookstore and volunteer on Wednesdays along with him. V'Anne and Jack often had lunch at the store and maintained a friendship that lasted a long time.

V'Anne is a traveler, a painter, an author, and a grandmother. She has a B.S, from Willamette University and a masters from UP. V'Anne has been Vice President. on the Friends board of directors twice under two presidents including Terry Huber. V'Anne has contributed so much while on the board, including being director of the Wish List Committee and the Nomination Committee. V'Anne has worked for ~30 years in education and has been a librarian twice. * \$10,000 donation to support programs for youth: Summer 2022 witnessed a return to robust programming for children, increased participation in the Summer Library Challenge, and a continued demand for take-away and in-house STEM and craft programs. Much of the donation will be used for over 2000 summer prize book incentives and programming supplies. Funds were also used to pay performers and host live programs for families in Rossman Park.

* \$14,000 donation to support programs for adults: This donation will help the library continue to offer enriching educational and cultural opportunities to the Lake Oswego community, including Summer Library Challenge for Adults, BIPOC Women's Speaker Series, LOPL Trivia Night, First Tuesday Music Concerts; Second Wednesday Performing Arts, The Learning Group, Educational Programs and additional Cultural Programs.

* \$1,000 donation for program hospitality: As inperson programs resumed in 2022, this donation allowed the library to restore offering refreshments to event attendees well into 2023.
